THIS TRANSFER GUIDE CONTAINS IMPORTANT TRANSFER INFORMATION THAT CAN IMPACT A STUDENT'S ABILITY TO TRANSFER AND COMPLETE THEIR STUDIES IN A TIMELY MANNER.

The information on this sheet is subject to frequent change; students should contact the four-year school to keep informed of changes. Final responsibility for verifying all transfer information lies with the student.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

- There is no minimum number of hours required for admission to Columbia.
- Generally, if a student is in good standing at the last institution attended, admission to Columbia is assured. Contact the Admissions Office for more detailed information.
- Columbia and Harper have articulation agreements in Fashion Design and Fashion Merchandising.

TRANSFER CREDIT

Transfer courses must be completed with a C grade or better and must be similar or equivalent in content to those offered by Columbia. All final decisions are made by Columbia. All transfer students will receive an official transcript evaluation as part of the admissions process.

- The maximum number of credit hours accepted from a two-year college is 62.
- The maximum number of credits accepted from a combination of two-year college and CLEP, AP, military, and/or life experience is 62 credit hours.
- If a student attended both a four-year and a two-year college, the maximum number of credit hours accepted in transfer is 88, with no more than 62 credit hours accepted from a two-year college.
- The final 12 credit hours needed for graduation must be taken at Columbia College Chicago.
- A maximum of four credit hours in physical education is accepted.
- A maximum of nine credit hours in foreign language is accepted.
- Topics, independent study, internships, ESL, adult education, continuing education, workshops, seminars, and developmental courses (those courses usually numbered below 100) are not transferable.

APPLICATION

Students have the option to either fill out the Columbia Application or the Common Application. Both applications require:

- One essay question
- One letter of recommendation
- \$35 application fee
- High School transcripts (all transfer students must submit high school transcripts)
- College transcripts
- Immunization records

ACT/SAT is recommended but not required. In many cases ACT scores may be used as an alternative to the College's placement tests.

ILLINOIS ARTICULATION INITIATIVE (IAI)

Effective fall 2014, Columbia College Chicago participates in the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) as a receiving institution. The IAI is a statewide agreement that allows transfer students coming from participating Illinois institutions who meet certain criteria to complete the General Education Core Curriculum (GECC) in lieu of the Columbia College Chicago Liberal Arts and Sciences Core. Transfer students who are accepted to Columbia College Chicago and who meet at least one of the following criteria will be eligible for the IAI:

1. Earned Associate's degree from a participating Illinois institution
2. Completion of the GECC package at a participating Illinois institution
3. Completion of 30 transferable credits from one or more participating Illinois institutions

Students who meet 1. or 3. above who have not yet completed the GECC package will be permitted to do so while enrolled at Columbia College Chicago. In the event that the Columbia College Chicago Liberal Arts and Sciences Core leads to faster degree completion, the student may choose it instead of the GECC.

Transfer students who complete the GECC package in lieu of Columbia College Chicago's Liberal Arts and Sciences Core must still complete the following college-wide degree requirements, which may or may not be fulfilled in transfer:

- 6 credits of 2000-level or higher Liberal Arts and Sciences Core courses
- 3 credits of Global Awareness
- 3 credits of United States Pluralism

In addition, all Columbia College Chicago students are required to complete one course coded as Writing Intensive while in residence. This requirement is not transferrable. Courses coded as Writing Intensive are denoted with a "WI" in the course catalog and schedule. WI courses may also satisfy major, minor, GECC, or Liberal Arts and Sciences Core requirements.

Transfer students entering Columbia College Chicago from participating Illinois institutions with 29 or fewer transferrable credits are required to complete the Liberal Arts and Sciences Core.

TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIPS

Columbia offers the Transfer Achievement Award for \$8,500/year for students who maintain a 3.0 GPA. The award is renewable. The application deadline is February 1st for Fall and December 15th for Spring.

Below is the Columbia College Chicago Liberal Arts and Sciences Core Curriculum. Students can opt to complete the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) General Education Core Curriculum (GECC), (Groups 1-5 of Harper's 1998 or later AA/AS degree) in lieu of this curriculum. By completing the IAI GECC, students will have met the general education requirements of Columbia College Chicago. Individual majors may require additional course work for admission and/or additional general education course work for graduation. Students transferring with the IAI GECC must still fulfill the requirements below in gray.

Final decisions regarding the acceptance of credit rest with Columbia College Chicago.

In consultation with academic advisors and department chairpersons, highly motivated students may chart and interdisciplinary course of study, that meets career and academic goals, and integrates one or more disciplines offered in the Columbia curriculum.
