General Transfer Admissions Policies

Kendall College accepts transfer credits from colleges and universities accredited by agencies recognized by the American Council on Education (ACE), United States Secretary of Education, College Level Examination Program (CLEP), DSST and Advanced Placement (AP).

The college accepts courses with a grade C or grade point average value of 2.0 or higher.

To be eligible for transfer credit, official transcripts must be submitted to the Office of Admissions by the end of the student's first quarter of study at Kendall.

Transfer courses are recorded as credit earned and are not computed into the student's GPA at Kendall College or the student's enrollment status for any given term.

Kendall College credits are recorded in quarter hours. Semester hours are multiplied by 1.5 to calculate the equivalency to quarter hours.

All transcripts received become the official property of Kendall College and will not be returned or issued to the student or to another institution.

Evaluations will be kept in the student's academic file. All evaluations are considered provisional until official transcripts are received.
