### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

- At least 20 hours of transferrable credit

Minimum GPA by College/School:

- Arts and Sciences – 2.0
- Business – 2.0
- Communication – 2.3
- Education – 2.5
- Health Systems Management – 2.5
- Social Work – 2.5
- Continuing and Professional Education – 2.5

Students who have earned fewer than 20 hours of acceptable credit must submit their high school transcript and ACT or SAT scores. Transfers who submit applications for admission will be considered for Academic Scholarships (\$2,000 and \$3,000 per semester) and Phi Theta Kappa Scholarships (\$1,500 per semester).

### ADDITION INFORMATION FOR BUSINESS AND EDUCATION MAJORS

## **TRANSFER CREDIT**

Transfer of credit is awarded on a course-by-course basis. Grades of D+, D, and F are not acceptable for credit. Loyola has a policy to accept all academic courses (non-vocational and non-remedial) at the 100-level to satisfy at the least elective credit. Transfer credit from two-year colleges is limited to 64 semester hours.

## **FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT**

Introductory course 1 and 2 in same language (or equivalent), or pass a Loyola proficiency exam at the 102-level or above. The foreign language requirement applies only to students who are entering the College of Arts and Sciences. It is not a requirement for the School of Business, the School of Nursing, the School of Education, or the School of Social Work. The language requirement is a graduation requirement; students do not need language courses completed prior to transfer.

## **CALCULATION OF ADMISSION GRADE POINT AVERAGE**

Although grades of D+, D, and F are not acceptable for credit, they will be calculated into the entering student's cumulative grade point average. All attempts of repeated courses will also be counted.

## **APPLICATION PRIORITY DEADLINES**

Fall semester - June 1

Spring semester - November 1

## **TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIPS**

Loyola offers a Transfer Academic scholarship. To be eligible applicants need a minimum 3.0 GPA, and at least 30 semester hours of transferable credit. Scholarship deadlines are July 1<sup>st</sup> for fall, and November 1<sup>st</sup> for spring. The award ranges between \$7,000-\$10,000 and is renewable for up to two years. This scholarship is also available to international students who meet the requirements and have a TOEFL score of 550 on the paper based test, 213 on the computer-based test, or 80 on the Internet-based test. Phi Theta Kappa members who are full-time students beginning in the fall or spring semester are eligible for \$3,000/year. It is renewable with a 3.0 GPA. Students applying for the Phi Theta Kappa scholarship are also eligible for the Transfer Academic Scholarship.
