

THE DEGREE COMPLETION PROGRAM between Harper College's Associate of Arts (AA) or Associate of Science (AS) degrees and Roosevelt University's Fast Track Bachelor of Professional Studies degree in Organizational Leadership provides adult students at HARPER COLLEGE the opportunity to complete a bachelor's degree developed for adult learners in less time than it would take to complete a traditional bachelor's degree.

HARPER/ROOSEVELT DEGREE COMPLETION PROGRAM FOR THE FAST TRACK BACHELOR OF PROFESSIONAL STUDIES IN ORGANIZATIONAL COMMUNICATION

Students who complete their AA or AS degrees at HARPER COLLEGE can complete a bachelor's degree in as few as 39 additional semester hours.

GRADUATE SCHOOL OPPORTUNITIES

If their long-term goal is a master's degree, students can earn both the bachelor's and the master's in the time it would take to complete a traditional bachelor's degree.

RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

All students must complete a minimum of 30 semester hours at Roosevelt University.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Students will submit applications for admission and official transcripts from all colleges attended to the Roosevelt University Office of Admissions. Students with fewer than 15 semester hours of college credit will submit an official high school or GED transcript. A minimum GPA of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale (C average) is required for admission.

All entering students take the Roosevelt University Assessment (RUA) to determine placements in English and mathematics.

THE FAST TRACK BACHELOR OF PROFESSIONAL STUDIES DEGREE AT ROOSEVELT UNIVERSITY

The Fast Track Bachelor of Professional Studies (BPS) degree is a fully accredited bachelor's degree program designed exclusively for adults 24 years or older. By combining interdisciplinary general education seminars with strong academic majors, you can earn a BPS degree in up to one-third less time than it takes to earn a traditional bachelor's degree.

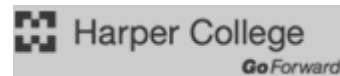
The Bachelor of Professional Studies program began at Roosevelt University in 1966, making it one of the oldest adult degree programs in the Chicago area. It has over 8,000 graduates, and it is the largest single degree program at Roosevelt University.

Flexibility is a key component of this degree program. Its small classes encourage interactive communities of learners. You can take as many or as few courses each semester as you choose, balancing school with the demands of work and family.

The Fast Track Bachelor of Professional Studies degree offers special options for transfer students. Fast Track degree completion options like the one outlined on this sheet are designed specifically for community college graduates. The *Transitions to Graduate Study* program helps adult students earn both a master's and a bachelor's degree in the time it would take to earn a traditional bachelor's degree alone.

ACADEMIC MAJOR IN ORGANIZATIONAL LEADERSHIP

The major in Organizational Leadership prepares you for leadership roles in a global economy and evolving workforce. You'll study topics most contemporary organizations are facing such as diversity, organizational change, decision-making, group dynamics, conflict resolution and negotiation. Communication is the basis of effective leadership, and two courses in organizational communication form the foundation of this program. A five-course certificate is embedded into the degree program, and the entire degree program is available in a fully online format via the internet.
