NEW BUSINESS: Recommendation --Order, Building B Complex

At this time Chairman Haas stated that, if the Board had no objections, the Board would move on to Approval of Change the Recommendation for Approval of Change Order for the Building B Complex, and Chairman Haas asked Mr. Robert Fridstein, of Fridstein Fitch & Partners, to address the Board.

> Mr. Fridstein spoke briefly on the status of the building project, informing the Board that a computer program had been established on the project so the architects know monthly where they stand. the project is on schedule except for Building B. Mr. Fridstein stated his purpose in appearing before the Board was to discuss the proposed change order for the Building B Addition in the amount of \$103,135.00, or approximately \$18.50 a square foot. He pointed out that the plan had been reviewed by the Harper staff and was acceptable to the faculty; that some modifications had been made in the original plan to better suit the program. Mr. Fridstein requested that the Board make a decision on this addition, in order to prevent any further delays on Building B.

Chairman Haas stated that every member of the Board should have every opportunity to study this proposal, and determined from the administration that there would be no diverse effects if this proposal were deferred.



Facilities Discussion

Dr. Lahti reported the administration had been considering the possibility of moving the present office from the Palatine location to some portion of the present facility at 1200 Algonquin Road. He stated that Mr. Mann and his staff had studied what could be done in terms of remodeling.

NEW BUSINESS:

(Cont.)

Mr. Mann displayed plans for the remodeling, pointing out that in the administration section there would be provision for a Board room. Mr. Mann stated this would be a minimal facility and included plans to convert it into locker rooms and showers for physical education use when the administration offices move into the permanent facility. He pointed out that area would be provided for library and technical processing, two classrooms including one key punch room, storage, reproduction and duplicating, and central receiving. The total cost would be \$21,789.00, which would include an additional two people. phase-out on these two people would be that upon completion a full-time custodian of this facility would be needed, and the other person would become the parking lot supervisor at Forest View High School next September.

Member Johnson moved and Member Hansen seconded the motion to adopt the remodeling plans for administrative complex, with the cost not to exceed \$17,300 on administrative phase.

Dr. Lahti reported on facility planning for next year, stating that the administration has been working with District 214 for some months trying to work out space accommodations for students. He informed the Board that if the college were successful in obtaining minimum space in Elk Grove High School and Forest View High School, they could avoid the need for a temporary unit.

Ernst & Ernst Consulting Proposal Dr. Lahti discussed the problems faced by the accounting department under the present hand system of accounting, due to the rapid growth of Harper College.

Mr. Mann presented the recommendation by the administration for engaging the services of Ernst & Ernst for consulting work in the Business Office. NEW BUSINESS: Ernst & Ernst Consulting Proposal (Cont.) Mr. Mann pointed out the accounting system will need to be expanded in September, 1968, and a concentrated effort will be necessary in order to insure a smooth transition to data processing during 1968-69. The key to this phase-in will be to have an intermediate system that has been planned to be compatible with data processing. He stated that the present staff does not have the necessary time to complete this type of analysis.

Member Hamill moved and Member Hansen seconded the motion to approve the employment of Ernst & Ernst for consulting work in the Business Office on the modification of the existing accounting system to an intermediate system which will phase into data processing, at a cost not to exceed \$2,000.00.

Chairman Haas complimented Secretary Nicklas on the manner in which she conducted the meeting approximately a month ago of the I.A.J.C. Conference of the Board Division. He thanked her on behalf of the Board for the tremendous job she had done.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that for said election the officials to conduct the same shall be appointed in apt time, that the affidavits to be used at said election shall be so prepared and used by the judges of said election that the same shall be numbered and be used in lieu of the poll list and poll book as provided for by the provisions of Section 9-14 of the School Code and prior to any votes being taken at said election, the judges of election shall severally take and subscribe to an oath or affirmation on separate blanks to be prepared for such purpose and responsive to the requirements contained in Section 9-8 of the School Code, all to be responsive to the requirements contained in Section 9-14 of said School Code, and this resolution shall be effective forthwith and a proper record shall be made by the Secretary of this Board of each step had and taken in the calling of and noticing

of said special election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of this Board be and hereby is authorized, empowered and instructed to appoint, in full conformity with the law, judges of election to serve at said precinct polling places on the said election day, as statutorily set forth.

CHAIRMEN OF DIVISIONS

- 1. <u>Designation</u>. The members of the academic staff of the college in charge of instructional divisions, which have been approved by the president of the college, shall be designated as division chairmen, which designations shall be in addition to their academic rank.
- 2. <u>Term.</u> Chairmen shall be appointed and reappointed by the president of the college after consultation with appropriate faculty including the division concerned. Such appointment shall be for any period up to three years, and renewable provided, however, that the president of the college may after consultation relieve an appointee of his duties as chairman at any time.
- 3. <u>Termination of Appointment as Chairman</u>. If the chairman of a division of the college is relieved of his duties as chairman he shall retain such rights and privileges as he may have by virtue of his academic rank.
- 4. <u>Responsibilities</u>. The chairmen of divisions of the college shall, in consultation with their respective faculties, be responsible to the president of the college through the appropriate administrators for the supervision of the personnel and educational program of the divisions they serve. They shall have such other powers, duties and responsibilities as may be assigned by the president of the college.

This position was approved by the Board with a salary range of \$11,000-\$13,000. The following information is provided to justify the recommended salary:

- Mr. Moeller's administrative experience relates directly to the position.
- He possesses knowledge and experience in data processing as it relates to registration and records.
- 3. He was the author of a Title III Proposal which resulted in a \$1.5 million dollar grant to Oak Park-River Forest High School (Library Electronic Storage and Retrieval system). This experience could, in the future, be of considerable value to Harper College.
- 4. His current salary is \$15,900. However, he is willing to accept the salary differential to become associated with an institution of higher education.

In summary, we feel this is a highly qualified candidate whose abilities and experience would be an asset to our institution.

I. Subject:

Possible remodeling of the barn for administrative offices and future P.E. locker room.

II. Reason for Consideration by the Board

It is possible to obtain a substantial savings by remodeling an area of the barn for both administrative and physical education purposes.

III. Information

- A. At the present time the monthly rental for the Palatine office is \$1,020.00, plus \$90.00 for cleaning. On a yearly basis this amounts to \$13,300.00.
- B. The physical education department has requested that the barn be used as a temporary P. E. station. It would be desirable to provide men and women's shower facilities.
- C. Rough estimates indicate that the North stable area could be remodeled for administrative purposes with allowances made for shower facilities. When the administrative unit moves to the campus, a minor conversion of the space would provide the P.E. locker and shower room space at a small cost to the college.
- D. Assuming remodeling for the administrative area could be accomplished by July 1, 1968, in the area of \$13,000 to \$15,000 would be available to pay for the remodeling based on current rental costs of the Palatine office.

IV. Recommendation

A detailed cost estimate is being prepared and will be available by next Thursday's Board meeting. Subject to reviewing the final figures, the administration recommends that the joint administrative and P.E. facilities remodeling project be approved by the Board of Trustees.

I. Subject:

Consideration of an expenditure of \$1,800 to \$2,000 to Ernst & Ernst for consulting work in the business office.

II. Reason for Consideration by the Board:

At the present time the comptroller's office is preparing extensive financial reports both for the Board and for internal reporting. All of the information is obtained from a complex system of bookkeeping. Because our system will have to be expanded for September, 1968, and a conversion to data processing will be made during 1968-69, a concentrated effort is necessary in order to insure a smooth transition.

III. Analysis:

- A. There are three basic questions to be resolved.
 - 1. Should we staff at a level to sustain a hand system through the fall with the possibility of having surplus bookkeepers?
 - 2. Should we design an intermediate system to meet the demand for this fall that could be easily phased into data processing?
 - 3. When and how will we phase into data processing during 1968-69? While a parallel operation will be instituted for the phase-in, the fact remains that payrolls and statements must be produced on time and accurately. Because of the nature of accounting, a thorough examination of possible problems and the development of appropriate control features cannot be overemphasized.
- B. Our Comptroller, Mr. Dolejs, has the training and experience to complete this type of analysis; however, he does not have the necessary time to launch the concentrated effort that is required to adequately plan a program. His time can better be used to critically analyse the consultants' work and plan for the actual implementation of proposed solutions.

C. The data processing staff needs a reference point to smoothly phase our operation into data processing. The key to this phase-in will be to have an intermediate system that has been planned to be compatible with data processing.

IV. Recommendation:

It is recommended that Ernst & Ernst be employed at a fee of \$1,800-2,000 to accomplish the ends set forth in this report.

We understand that the purpose of such a review would be to develop recommendations for implementing improvements and simplifications in the accounting system. This review would place particular emphasis upon developing recommendations for revising the accounting system in terms of the projected expansion of the college in the immediate future.

Our approach to this assignment would be to interview the personnel of the Business Office and to analyze procedures in the following areas:

Requisitioning
Purchasing
Receiving
Cash disbursements
Cash receipts
Payroll computation, preparation and reporting
General and encumbrance accounting
Financial report preparation for the Board of Trustees and for the divisions

We would evaluate the present work loads, and based upon projected student enrollments, would prepare reasonable estimates of increases in the volume of business transactions.

During and after this data gathering phase of the review we would develop recommendations for operational improvements as follows:

We would recommend revisions which could be installed on a fairly immediate basis. These revisions would most likely relate to changes in the manual procedures.

We would also recommend revisions which should be considered during the next one to two years prior to the conversion to electronic data processing methods. Wherever feasible the

short-term recommendations would relate to procedural revisions which would be compatible with future data processing applications.

We would prepare a tentative timetable for the conversion of the various Business Office procedures to electronic data processing methods. The target dates contained therein would be those deemed most practical for the continued convenient and uninterrupted operation of the Business Office. In order to determine the target dates, we would ask that you provide the following information:

The estimated date of installation of the electronic data processing equipment.

The priorities which have been established for the conversion of the procedures to data processing equipment including applications relating to student enrollment and other non-accounting areas.

We would review and comment upon the format of the monthly financial statements to determine that they are designed to provide financial information by areas of responsibility. This review would consider the proposed changes in the format of the financial statements which may result from any revisions in the accounting procedures.

At the conclusion of this assignment we would plan to discuss our findings and recommendations with you. In addition we would set forth these recommendations in a written report.

We estimate that our fee for this engagement would range from \$1,800 to \$2,000, based on our regular per diem rates. This work would be directed by Mr. S. R. Holstad, assisted by Mr. J. P. Guertin. This fee estimate does not cover our assistance in implementing any recommendations that may arise from this review.

We assure you that this assignment would receive our closest attention and we look forward to hearing from you.

Based on this recommendation, and concurrence from CRS, the administration recommends that the change order for the Building B Addition be approved, not to exceed \$103,135.00, subject to final approval by the administration.

Dear Bill:

Enclosed is a change order proposal for the building "B" addition in the amount of \$103,135.00.

The original proposal from Corbetta was for \$126,063.00. After a meeting in your office we were able to obtain a better understanding of your needs for this job, and together with negotiations with the contractor, the contractor's cost has been reduced substantially.

The reduction in cost is due to the following:

- 1. A reduction in the general contractor's mark-up on the mechanical and electrical work.
- 2. A reduction in the electrical contractor's mark-up.
- 3. Clarification of certain items in the concrete work.
- 4. Clarification of some of the intent of the electrical system and the elimination of 75% of the under-floor electrical distribution duct. Clarification of quantities of electrical fixtures, outlets, and other items which were included in the original building "B" contract.
- 5. Substantial "negotiations" with the contractors on the part of the architects and cooperation from the contractors.

The building cost is approximately \$18.50 per sq.ft. This compares favorably with the cost of the other buildings in the college.

Please note the request for extension of time for completion which is justified. The progress of the "B" building is seriously impeded by the allowance made for the addition of this proposed building. Therefore, if approval is to be made, it should be done as quickly as possible so that no further delays on building "B" will result.

Building "B" is scheduled to be completed, first in order that the mechanical equipment can be installed and made operative, and therefore, time is of the essence in this approximately.
