Do you like to write? Are you creatively inspired, intrigued by people and unafraid of deadlines? Become a communications professional—choose a career in journalism. The journalist must possess an inexhaustible fountain of curiosity and an ability to discover and express ideas. Journalism is the vehicle to communicate those discoveries

A job in journalism can take you as far as you want to go... from a weekly newspaper to network television, from a multi-person public relations department to a home-based freelance business of your own.

Your career path will be multi-faceted and offer you many alternatives. With this in mind, the journalism certificate curriculum at Harper is designed to train you in a variety of options:

- Media Design**
- Media Writing**
- Media Writing/Design**
- Online Communications**

### **Media Design Certificate**

Writing is only one aspect of a career in journalism. Many jobs require design skills, too. You may be called upon to layout the newsletter you edited, select photos to accompany a feature article, write copy to fit a particular format. And although you may not actually do the designing yourself, you may supervise the person who does. Whatever your situation, the bottom line is this: the more you know about graphics, the more employable you become.

### **Media Writing Certificate**

No matter which media you choose—print, broadcast, or Internet—solid writing skills are fundamental to success in the field of journalism. This 18-credit hour certificate program is designed to help you polish your grammar skills and perfect your overall writing abilities.

### **Media Writing and Design Certificate**

When it comes to finding a job in the field of journalism, extensive knowledge of writing and design can increase your marketability. This 21-credit-hour certificate program helps you polish your skills in both areas.

### **Online Communications Certificate**

The Internet is today's fastest-growing form of communication. In fact, the experts who study media trends predict that in the not-too-distant future, online communications will outdistance newspapers, magazines, radio, and television as the preferred source of news among a majority of Americans. If you're already a journalist—or simply aspiring to become one—now is the time to prepare.

While the number of traditional media outlets may decline in the years ahead, the number of websites and on-line publications will almost certainly be on the rise. And they're going to need competent writers, editors, and designers. This 18 to 19-credit-hour certificate program will get you ready to respond. In addition to traditional classes in journalism fundamentals and graphic design, you'll learn about communication as it specifically relates to the Internet. Courses focus on writing and designing for the computer screen, on-line publishing, website development and applications, and the use of the Internet as a powerful communications tool.

## Sign Language

American Sign Language (ASL) is the primary language of more than 550,000 Deaf and Hard of Hearing Americans and Canadians.

So how do people who don't know American Sign Language communicate with those persons who use ASL? One way is by working with Sign Language Interpreters.

Sign Language Interpreters, like foreign language interpreters, facilitate communication between two parties who come from different language and cultural backgrounds. Individuals wanting to become an English/ASL interpreter need to have fluency in both

languages and an understanding of both cultures. Interpreting requires dedication, training and practice. Harper College is the place that can provide you with opportunities to learn these skills.

Harper's certificate program is designed to provide students with entry level interpreting and transliterating skills, a general knowledge of deaf culture and an understanding of the interpreting profession. Students enrolled in the program need to possess fluency in American Sign Language and English. Additionally, they need to have met the prerequisites for entry into the program. For individuals who are not fluent in sign language,

Harper College offers five levels of American Sign Language to assist them in acquiring the necessary skills. ASL course placement services are also available for individuals transferring to Harper College from other institutions or for those who already have some sign language skills.

Upon completion of the Sign Language Interpreting Program, individuals are encouraged to take both the written and performance examinations necessary to qualify for state and/or national credentials as a sign language interpreter.

## NetPrep™

The Harper College NetPrep™ Program is an innovative partnership between business and education that provides training for what has been identified as the fastest growing job specialty in the information technology (IT) field—computer networking. Developed in conjunction with 3COM, a leader in data, voice and video communications technology, NetPrep™ is a standards-based training curriculum for high school and college students focusing on the design, implementation, management and integration of computer networks.

Individual courses in the NetPrep™ program cover such topics as networking fundamentals, local area networks (LANs), wide area networks (WANs), network architectures, the Internet, processes and protocols,

internetworking devices and enterprise networks. Independently approved by the National Association of Communications Systems Engineers (NACSE), NetPrep™ enables students to immediately enter productive careers upon completion of the program.

The NetPrep™ program offers two options:

- NetPrep™ Network Specialist Certificate
- NetPrep™ Senior Network Specialist Certificate

Note: High school juniors and seniors enroll in a dual credit program, which allows them to earn up to 12 hours of college credit and the Student Network Technical certificate while still attending high school. After graduation, the credits earned may be applied toward completion of the Senior Network Specialist certificate at Harper.

### Requirements for the Illinois CPA Certificate

To sit for the first time as a candidate for the Illinois CPA examination, one must have successfully completed at least 150 semester hours of acceptable college level credit, including at least a bachelor's degree. The 150 total hours must include an accounting concentration and a business concentration.

• At least 24 semester hours in accounting at the undergraduate or graduate level, including courses covering the subjects of financial accounting, auditing, taxation, and management accounting. At Harper this would include ACC 101, 102, 201, 202, 203, 250, 253 and 254.

• At least 24 semester hours of business courses, or substantially equivalent (other than accounting courses) at the undergraduate or graduate level. Acceptable courses are: Economics, Business Law\*\*, Marketing, Finance, Business and Technical Communications, Business Ethics, International Business, Legal and Social Environment of Business, Management, Information Systems, Quantitative Methods. Other courses are subject to the review by the Illinois Board of Examiners.

\*\*Business Law is a recommended course because it is tested on the CPA Exam.

Any candidate who sat for the CPA exam previously to January 1, 2001 is not required to complete the 150 hour requirement.

### Requirements for the CMA Certificate

The CMA (Certified Management Accountant) is a national program with no state affiliates. The candidate must have senior standing at an accredited college or university, or must hold a baccalaureate degree, in any field, or have passed the U.S. CPA examination. Anyone who has passed the U.S. CPA examination is given credit for part 2 of the CMA examination. Recommended courses at Harper include ACC 101, 102, 201, 202, 203, 211, 212, 251, 253 and 254; ECO 210, 211 and 212; MGT 111, 218, 225 and 270; MTH 124; PHI 110 and CIS 101.

# Adult Educational Development

The Adult Educational Development (AED) Department offers Basic Skills, Pre-GED, GED, Citizenship Training, Employment Skills and Special Topics courses for persons who are over 16 years of age and who are not currently enrolled in high school. The department offers the Nonnative Literacy Program for persons whose first language is not English. On-site customized academic skills classes for business and industry are offered through Workforce and Professional Development. Student placement, achievement, GED predictive and career interest testing, and other advising services are also available. Classes are offered free of charge or for a low fee through support of federal and state grant funds.

The GED Testing Program is intended primarily for adults 19 years of age or older; however, students 17 and 18 years of age may test if they meet other eligibility requirements.

Students may register for Basic Skills, Pre-GED, GED, Citizenship and Employment classes at Harper's main campus or the Harper Northeast Center. Registration for Nonnative Literacy classes will be held only at the off-campus location where classes are taught: the Harper Northeast Center, Police Neighborhood Resource Center and the Northeast Palatine Community Center.

All Adult Educational Development classes are open entry; open enrollment is generally allowed throughout the session in all classes if space is available. # Things you should know.

## Eligibility

All high school graduates or the equivalent are eligible for admission to the College. A non-graduate 16 or 17 years of age who has severed his or her connection with the high school system, as certified in writing by the chief executive officer (or designee) of the high school district in which the student has legal residence, or a non-graduate 18 years or older may be admitted if he or she demonstrates the capacity to benefit from programs and courses offered by the College. To be placed in some programs in the College, the applicant may be required to meet additional requirements as specified by that program.

## College Credit from Other Institutions

Students seeking a certificate or degree from Harper College and wanting to transfer credits from another college should complete a Transcript Evaluation Request at the Registrar's Office, Student and Administration Center, A213. Students must have an official transcript from each college attended sent to Harper College's Admissions Office.

Students wishing to use previous college level math, English, and other credits to fulfill Harper course prerequisites must bring transcripts or grade reports to registration and to the first day of class. Students do not need to request an evaluation for this purpose. Questions about previous college courses can be directed to the Registrar's Office, 847.925.6500.

## Testing

Assessment testing is required of any student entering his or her first college level English or math course and must be completed prior to registration. The full assessment includes writing, reading and math testing, and it will take approximately two hours to complete. Photo identification is required. Please check the "Guide to Student Services" for Assessment Center hours.

## Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI)

If you are a new student starting at Harper summer 1998 or later, you may be eligible to participate in a state-wide agreement called the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) designed to help Illinois college students transfer easily. By earning the 1998 (or later) AA or AS degree at Harper, you will have completed a General Education Core Curriculum which is transferrable to more than 100 participating Illinois colleges and universities. Or, if you are not looking to earn a degree before transfer, you can complete just the Core Curriculum at Harper and know that your general education courses will transfer to the other participating colleges and universities. ## Limited Enrollment Programs

Enrollment in certain career programs requires admission to the College and fulfillment of specific requirements for admission to the program. (Contact Admissions Office, 847.925.6765 for details.) These limited enrollment programs are Cardiac Technology, Dental Hygiene, Emergency Medical Technician, Nursing (RN and LPN) and Certified Nursing Assistant. Some courses and sections which are offered only to students in limited enrollment programs are not listed in this course schedule.

## Hope Tax Credit

For the first two years of college, you or your parents can claim a new nonrefundable 100 percent tax credit up to \$1000 of tuition and fees per year, 50 percent credit for the next \$1000. This tax credit allows you to claim tuition and fee expenses if you enroll in a degree or certificate program for at least six credit hours.

## Lifetime Learning Tax Credit

This credit will be permitted for subsequent education. This is a 20 percent nonrefundable tax credit up to \$5000 of direct educational expenses paid. Other tax benefits may be available to students and families. Additional information on these benefits and other sources of funding is available from the Office of Student Financial Assistance, Student and Administration Center, A364, 847.925.6248.

## Auditing a Course

A student who wishes to audit a course will be required to pay full tuition and fees and must obtain approval from the instructor, department chair or dean before enrolling in the class. Registration for audit status may be completed only during final registration the first week of classes and must be the original enrollment in the class. Students taking the class for credit are given priority.

A student who wishes to review his or her education records must complete the appropriate form and submit it to the Registrar. The student will be notified in writing of a date and time he or she may come to review the records.

The following student data is hereby designated as "Directory Information" and as such may be disclosed or released by the College for any purpose and at its discretion: Student Name, Home Address, Home Telephone, Major Area of Study, Dates of Attendance, Degrees/Certificates Earned, Awards Received, Last College Attended, Officially Recognized Activities, Date and Place of Birth, Weights and Heights of Members of Athletic Teams.

To have any or all of the "Directory Information" withheld, the student must give written notice,

in person or by certified mail, return receipt requested and addressed to the Registrar by the first day of each course or program, as the case may be, for which he/she is enrolled.

William Rainey Harper College has adopted policies and procedures implementing The Act, which are contained in the William Rainey Harper College Student Handbook/Datebook.

# Quick Guide to Admissions, Advising and Registration Spring 2001

## NEW full-time students

Those planning to enroll in 12 or more credit hours:

You are a "New Student" if you have not previously been admitted to and have never been enrolled in credit courses at Harper College. You will need to complete an application for admission before you register. Applications are available online, [harper-college.com](http://harper-college.com), in the Admissions Office, New Student Services and Art Center, C101, or by calling 847.925.6700.

### STEP 1

Complete the application for admission, and submit it and a \$25 nonrefundable fee to the Harper College Admissions Office.

### STEP 2

Submit to the Harper College Admissions Office an official high school transcript or GED results and official transcripts from each college attended. ACT results are also required unless you have completed 12 or more semester hours of previous college credit or are 24 years of age or older.

### STEP 3

Watch for your invitation to a full-time student Orientation program. In Part I of Orientation you will become acquainted with Harper College student life and complete mandatory computerized assessment testing which determines your course placement in English, reading and math. You may be eligible for a waiver of testing with appropriate ACT scores and/or college transcripts. Details will be included with your invitation to Orientation.

### STEP 4

Attend Part II of Orientation which includes information on Harper College programs, policies and resources, an individual advising session with a counselor and registration for your classes.

### STEP 5

Pay tuition and fees by the due date given to you at the time of registration.

## NEW part-time students

Those planning to enroll in fewer than 12 credit hours:

### STEP 1

Complete the application for admission, and submit it and a \$25 nonrefundable fee to the Harper College Admissions Office. Part-time degree-seeking students are also required to submit an official high school transcript or GED results and official transcripts from each college attended. Part-time non-degree seeking students are not required to provide transcripts.

### STEP 2

You are encouraged to attend a new student advising session. These small group sessions last about one and one-half hours and will give you information about Harper College programs, services, admission requirements and registration procedures. They also include an opportunity for each group member to speak with an advisor regarding course selection. Call 847.925.6208 to reserve a seat. Morning, afternoon and evening sessions are available.

### STEP 3

If you plan to enroll in your first college level English and/or math course, you must take computerized writing, reading and/or math assessment tests. Test results determine your placement in those courses and must be completed prior to registration. You may be eligible for a waiver of testing with appropriate ACT scores and/or college transcripts. Contact the Center for New Students and Orientation at 847.925.6208, or the Assessment Center at 847.925.6541 for details.

### STEP 4

Select class times and sign up for classes. New part-time students can use operator-assisted telephone, e-mail or walk-in registration to enroll in courses. See page 34 for registration options and instructions.

### STEP 5

## Currently and previously enrolled credit students

#### Dropping college credit classes

- During the refund period, students who wish to drop one or more of their college classes for which they are registered may do so in the Office of the Registrar, Student and Administration Center, A213. To be eligible for a refund, students must withdraw during the refund period specified above. Refund based on the above refund schedule.
- The Business Office will disperse refunds by mail. Refunds will be processed by check, or, if payment was by credit card, applied to credit card account. Refunds will be processed within 4-6 weeks.
- After the refund period, a formal written notice to drop one or more full semester classes or to withdraw from the College must be submitted to the Registrar's Office in person by Saturday, April 14, at 12:00 noon. The student's record will show "W" for withdraw.
- Students who simply stop attending for any reason and

who do not submit their written notice for dropping a class(es) will not receive any refund and are subject to an "F" grade.

- **Students who have not officially withdrawn from a class(es) prior to the start of the term will be held liable for tuition whether or not payment has already been made.**

**Senior Citizen Discount** is available to district residents 60 years of age and older. They will be assessed a 50 percent tuition to credit courses that are dedicated specifically to senior citizens. District residents age 65 years of age and older are eligible for a 100 percent discount for all credit courses during late registration. Late registration is the first day of the term or the first day of the session in which the class meets. This must be the student's initial enrollment in the class and there must be space available. Students may not drop and reenroll for the discount.

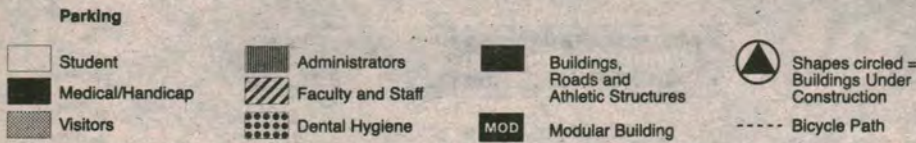
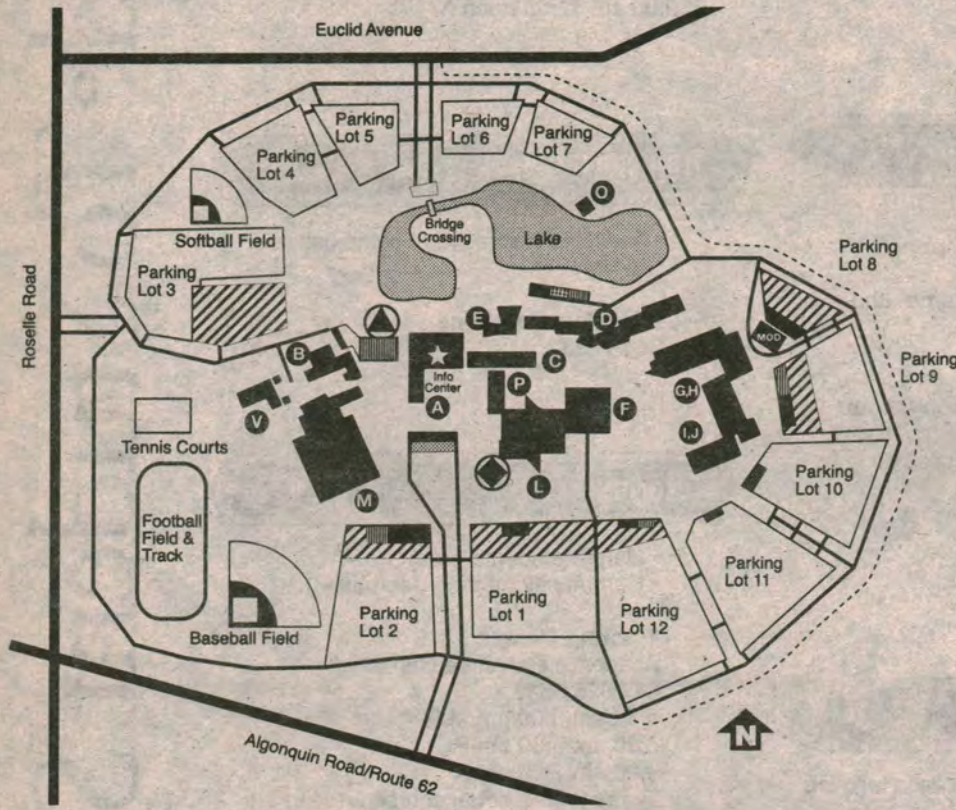
