Requirements for the Illinois CPA Certificate

To sit for the first time as a candidate for the Illinois CPA examination, one must have successfully completed at least 150 semester hours of acceptable college level credit, including at least a bachelor's degree. The 150 total hours must include an accounting concentration and a business concentration.

At least 24 semester hours in accounting at the undergraduate or graduate level, including courses covering the subjects of financial accounting, auditing, taxation, and management accounting. At Harper

this would include ACC 101, 102, 201, 202, 203, 250, 253 and 254.

At least 24 semester hours of business courses, or substantially equivalent (other than accounting courses) at the undergraduate or graduate level. Acceptable courses are: Economics, Business Law**, Marketing, Finance, Business and Technical Communications, Business Ethics, International Business, Legal and Social Environment of Business, Management, Information Systems, Quantitative Methods. Other courses are subject to the review by the Illinois Board of Examiners.

**Business Law is a recommended course because it is tested on the CPA Exam.

Any candidate who sat for the CPA exam previously to January 1, 2001, is not required to complete the 150

Requirements for the CMA Certificate

The CMA (Certified Management Accountant) is a national program with no state affiliates. The candidate must have senior standing at an accredited college or university, or must hold a baccalaureate degree, in any field, or have passed the U.S. CPA examination. Anyone who has passed the U.S. CPA examination is given credit for part 2 of the CMA examination. Recommended courses at Harper include ACC 101, 102, 201, 202, 203, 211, 212, 251, 253 and 254; ECO 210, 211 and 212; MGT 111, 218, 225 and 270; MTH 124; PHI 110 and CIS 101.

Adult Educational Development

The Adult Educational Development (AED) Department offers Basic Skills, Pre-GED, GED, Citizenship Training, Employment Skills and Special Topics courses for persons who are over 16 years of age and who are not currently enrolled in high school. The department offers the Nonnative Literacy Program for persons whose first language is not English. On-site customized academic skills classes for business and industry are offered through Workforce and Professional Development. Student placement, achievement, GED predictive and career interest testing, and other advising services are also available. Classes are offered free of charge or for a low fee through support of federal and state grant funds.

The GED Testing Program is intended primarily for adults 19 years of age or older; however, students 17 and 18 years of age may test if they meet other eligibility requirements.

Students may register for Basic Skills, Pre-GED, GED, Citizenship and Employment classes at Harper's main campus or the Harper Northeast Center. Registration for Nonnative Literacy classes will be held only at the off-campus location where classes are taught: the Harper Northeast Center, Police Neighborhood Resource Center, and the Northeast Palatine Community Center.

All Adult Educational Development classes are open entry; open enrollment is generally allowed throughout the session in all classes if space is available. Eligibility

All high school graduates or the equivalent are eligible for admission to the College. A nongraduate 16 or 17 years of age who has severed his or her connection with the high school system, as certified in writing by the chief executive officer (or designee) of the high school district in which the student has legal residence, or a non-graduate 18 years or older may be admitted if he or she demonstrates the capacity to benefit from programs and courses offered by the College. To be placed in some programs in the College, the applicant may be required to meet additional requirements as specified by that program.

College Credit from Other Institutions

Students seeking a certificate or degree from Harper College and wanting to transfer credits from another college should complete a Transcript Evaluation Request at the Registrar's Office, Student and Administration Center, A213. Students must have an official transcript from each college attended sent to Harper College's Admissions Office.

Students wishing to use previous college level math, English, and other credits to fulfill Harper course prerequisites must bring transcripts or grade reports to registration and to the first day of class. Students do not need to request an evaluation for this purpose. Questions about previous college courses can be directed to the Registrar's Office, 847.925.6500.

Testing

Assessment testing is required of any student entering his or her first college level English or math course and must be completed prior to registration. These limited enrollment programs are Cardiac Technology, Dental Hygiene, Emergency Medical Technician, Nursing (RN and LPN) and Certified Nursing Assistant. Some courses and sections which are offered only to students in limited enrollment programs are not listed in this course schedule.

Hope Tax Credit

For the first two years of college, you or your parents can claim a new nonrefundable 100 percent tax credit up to \$1000 of tuition and fees per year, 50 percent credit for the next \$1000. This tax credit allows you to claim tuition and fee expenses if you enroll in a degree or certificate program for at least six credit hours.

Lifetime Learning Tax Credit

This credit will be permitted for subsequent education. This is a 20 percent nonrefundable tax credit up to \$5000 of direct educational expenses paid. Other tax benefits may be available to students and families. Additional information on these benefits and other sources of funding is available from the Office of Student Financial Assistance, Student and Administration Center, A364, 847.925.6248.

Auditing a Course

A student who wishes to audit a course will be required to pay full tuition and fees and must obtain approval from the instructor, department chair or dean before enrolling in the class. Registration for audit status may be completed only during the first week of classes and must be the original enrollment in the class. Students taking the class for credit are given priority.

Quick Guide to Admissions, Advising and Registration Summer 2001

NEW students

You are a "New Student" if you have not previously been admitted to and have never been enrolled in credit courses at Harper College. You will need to complete an application for admission before you register. Applications are available online, in the Admissions Office, New Student Services and Art Center, C101, or by calling 847.925.6700.

STEP 1

Complete the application for admission, and submit it and a \$25 nonrefundable fee to the Harper College Admissions Office. Degree-seeking students are also required to submit an official high school transcript or GED results and official transcripts from each college attended. (Non-degree-seeking students are not required to provide transcripts.)

STEP 2

You are encouraged to attend a new student advising session. These small group sessions last about one and one-half hours and will give you information about Harper College programs, services, admission requirements and registration procedures. Morning, afternoon and evening sessions are available.

STEP 3

If you plan to enroll in your first college level English and/or math course, you must take computerized writing, reading and/or math assessment tests. Test results determine your placement in those courses and must be completed prior to registration. You may be eligible for a waiver of testing with appropriate ACT scores and/or college transcripts. STEP 4

Select class times and sign up for classes. New students can use e-mail, walk-in or operator-assisted telephone registration to enroll in courses. See page 18 for registration options and instructions.

STEP 5

Pay tuition and fees by the due date given to you at the time of registration.

If you apply to Harper for the summer session and plan to continue full time in the fall, please note that you will be invited to an orientation program which will include assessment testing, essential new student information, one-on-one counseling and registration.

Currently and previously enrolled credit students


