O Online Courses

A variety of courses are now available to students via the Web. Not only will you have the flexibility of class scheduling, you may also have the opportunity to communicate with your instructor and classmates via e-mail or through discussion forums. If you have access to a computer with specific hardware and software requirements, a modem, and online access through an Internet Service Provider (ISP), then Internet courses may be the perfect option for you.

O Telecourses

Harper offers a complete range of courses from economics to psychology that may be viewed on cable TV within the Harper district area. Each telecourse has a mandatory, on-campus orientation session in order to give you an introduction to the instructor and course expectations. Any missed classes can be viewed at the main campus Library or select area libraries. A taped set of classes may also be rented from the Bookstore for a fee. (As of the printing of this course schedule, some residents of Arlington Heights may not receive Harper cable broadcasts. Please check with your local cable provider to ensure accessibility.)

O TeleWeb Courses

Several courses are available as a combination of both telecourse and online learning. Students enrolled in a teleweb course attend class by watching cable TV broadcasts within the Harper district area or by viewing videotapes at home, at the Harper Library, or in select public libraries. (As of the printing of this course schedule, some residents of Arlington Heights may not receive Harper cable broadcasts. Please check with your local cable provider to ensure accessibility.) Course assignments are accessed via the Web. Students interact with peers/faculty and submit course work to their instructor via several Internet-based communication tools.

Open Entry Classes

Harper has designed this unique class format to meet the needs of many students. Maybe you are unable to attend regularly scheduled classes. Or you want to finish the course work more quickly or you're anxious to start, but the course has already begun. We just require a one-hour orientation, where the instructor will show you around the lab, hand out homework assignments and answer any questions. Open Entry instructors are available for guidance during posted office hours. Open Entry classes are offered in AutoCAD and Computer Information Systems. In addition, all Adult Educational Development classes are open entry.

Late Start Classes

The name says it all. Late Start classes begin after the normal start date of the semester. So if you've missed our scheduled registration, look through this schedule or check out our Web site at harpercollege.edu for Late Start Classes.

Requirements for the Illinois CPA Certificate

To sit for the first time as a candidate for the Illinois CPA examination, one must have successfully completed at least 150 semester hours of acceptable college level credit, including at least a bachelor's degree. The 150 total hours must include an accounting concentration and a business concentration.

- At least 24 semester hours in accounting at the undergraduate or graduate level, including courses covering the subjects of financial accounting, auditing, taxation, and management accounting. At Harper this would include ACC 101, 102, 201, 202, 203, 250, 251, 253 and 254.
 At least 24 semester hours of business courses, or substantially equivalent (other than accounting courses) at the undergraduate or graduate level. Acceptable courses are: Economics, Business Law^{**}, Marketing, Finance, Business and Technical Communications, Business Ethics, International Business, Lavel Acceptable Sections. Legal and Social Environment of Business, Management, Information Systems, Quantitative Methods. Other courses are subject to the review by the Illinois Board of Examiners. **Business Law is a recommended course because it is tested on the CPA Exam.

Any candidate who sat for the CPA exam prior to January 1, 2001, is not required to complete the 150 hour requirement.

Requirements for the CMA Certificate The CMA (Certified Management Accountant) is a national program with no state affiliates. The candidate must have senior standagement accountantly is a national program with no state annates. The candidate must have senior standing at an accredited college or university, or must hold a baccalaureate degree, in any field, or have passed the U.S. CPA examination. Anyone who has passed the U.S. CPA examination is given credit for part 2 of the CMA examination. Recommended courses at Harper include ACC 101, 102, 201, 202, 203, 211, 212, 251, 253 and 254; ECO 210, 211 and 212; MGT 111, 218, 225 and 270; MTH 124; PHI 110 and CIS 101.

Adult Educational Devel

The Adult Educational Development (AED) Department offers Basic Skills, Pre-GED, GED, Citizenship Training, Employment Skills and Special Topics courses for persons who are over 16 years of age and who are not currently enrolled in high school. The department offers the Nonnative Literacy Program for persons whose first language is not English. On-site customized academic skills classes for business and industry are offered through Workforce and Professional Development. Student placement, achievement, GED predictive and career interest testing, and other advising services are also available. Classes are offered free of charge or for a low fee through support of federal and state grant funds.

The GED Testing Program is intended primarily for adults 19 years of age or older; however, students 17 and 18 years of age may test if they meet other eligibility requirements.

Students may register for Basic Skills, Pre-GED, GED, Citizenship and Employment classes at Harper's main campus or the Harper Northeast Center. Registration for Nonnative Literacy classes will be held only at the off-campus location where classes are taught: the Harper Northeast Center, Police Neighborhood Resource Center, and the Northeast Palatine Community Center.

All Adult Educational Development classes are open entry; open enrollment is generally allowed throughout the session in all classes if space is available. College Hours

Offices are open for business Monday through Thursday, from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm, Friday from 8:00 am to 4:30 pm and Saturday from 9:00 am until 12:00 noon.

Cancellations

The College reserves the right to withdraw any section of any course if enrollment is not sufficient to warrant offering that section. An effort is made to reach students with information on cancellations.

Eligibility

All high school graduates or the equivalent are eligible for admission to the College. A nongraduate 16 or 17 years of age who has severed his or her connection with the high school system, as certified in writing by the chief executive officer (or designee) of the high school district in which the student has legal residence, or a non-graduate 18 years or older may be admitted if he or she demonstrates the capacity to benefit from programs and courses offered by the College. To be placed in some programs in the College, the applicant may be required to meet additional requirements as specified by that program.

Residency

A student who has resided within the State of Illinois and the Harper College district 30 days immediately prior to the start of the term is eligible to be classified as an in-district student for purposes of calculating appropriate tuition rate.

Proof of in-district status is required at the time of registration. Proof can include driver's license, voters registration card, check book, library card, lease, utility bill or tax bill.

Testing

Assessment testing is required of any student entering his or her first college level English or math course and must be completed prior to registration. The full assessment includes writing, reading and math testing, and it will take approximately two hours to complete. Photo identification is required. Please check the Guide to Student Services for the Assessment and Testing Center hours.

Limited Enrollment Programs

Enrollment in certain career programs requires admission to the College and fulfillment of specific requirements for admission to the program. (Contact Admissions Office, 847.925.6765 for details.) These limited enrollment programs are Cardiac Technology, Dental Hygiene, Electrocardiograph Technician, Emergency Medical Services, Emergency Medical Technician, Home Health Aide, Mammography, Nursing (RN and LPN), Certified Nursing Assistant and Phlebotomy. Some courses and sections which are offered only to students in limited enrollment programs are not listed in this course schedule.

Auditing a Course

A student who wishes to audit a course will be required to pay full tuition and fees and must obtain approval from the instructor, department chair or dean before enrolling in the class. Registration for audit status may be completed only during final registration the first week of classes and must be the original enrollment in the class. Students taking the class for credit are given priority.

Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI)

If you are a new student starting at Harper summer 1998 or later, you may be eligible to participate in a state-wide agreement called the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) designed to help Illinois college students transfer easily. Eligible students who earn the AA or AS degree at Harper will have completed a General Education Core Curriculum which is transferrable to more than 100 participating Illinois colleges and universities. If you are not looking to earn a degree before transfer, you can complete just the Core Curriculum at Harper and know that your general education courses will transfer to the other participating colleges and universities. You can get more information from the Center for New Students and Orientation, 847.925.6208, or visit the IAI Web site at www.iTransfer.org.

College Credit from Other Institutions

Students seeking a certificate or degree from Harper College and wanting to transfer credits from another college should complete a Transcript Evaluation Request at the Registrar's Office, Student and Administration Center, A213. Students must have an official transcript from each college attended sent to Harper College's Admissions Office.

Students wishing to use previous college level math, English, and other credits to fulfill Harper course prerequisites must bring transcripts or grade reports to registration and to the first day of class. Students do not need to request an evaluation for this purpose. Questions about previous college courses can be directed to the Registrar's Office, 847.925.6500.

Hope Tax Credit

For the first two years of college, you or your parents can claim a new nonrefundable 100 percent tax credit up to \$1000 of tuition and fees per year, 50 percent credit for the next \$1000. This tax credit allows you to claim tuition and fee expenses if you enroll in a degree or certificate program for at least six credit hours.

Lifetime Learning Tax Credit

This credit will be permitted for subsequent education. This is a 20 percent nonrefundable tax credit up to \$5000 of direct educational expenses paid. Other tax benefits may be available to students and families. Additional information on these benefits and other sources of funding is available from the Scholarships and Financial Assistance office, Student and Administration Center, A364, 847.925.6248.

Senior Citizen Discount

This discount is available to district residents 60 years of age and older. They will be assessed a 50 percent tuition to credit courses that are dedicated specifically to senior citizens. District residents age 65 years of age and older are eligible for a 100 percent discount for all credit courses during late registration. Late registration is the first day of the term or the first day of the session in which the class meets. This must be the student's initial enrollment in the class and there must be space available. Students may not drop and reenroll for the discount.

Education Service Agreement

Businesses within the Harper College district can now offer Harper in-district tuition rates to employees who live outside the College district but within Illinois. The Educational Services Agreement Program permits these employees of in-district businesses to attend Harper classes at in-district prices if their employers have registered for this unique program. The in-district tuition is available whether the cost is to be paid by the employees or by the company. Employers who are interested in this program should contact the Admissions Outreach Office, 847.925.6247.

Chargeback/Joint Agreement

Out-of-district students desiring to pursue a certificate or degree program at Harper that is not available at their community college may apply for a chargeback or joint agreement. If the application is approved, the student will be able to receive in-district rates. For further information call 847.925.6282.

The following student data is hereby designated as Directory Information and as such may be disclosed or released by the College for any purpose and at its discretion: Student Name, Home Address, Home Telephone, Major Area of Study, Dates of Attendance, Part-Time/Full-Time Enrollment Status, Degrees/Certificates Earned, Awards Received, Last College Attended, Officially Recognized Activities, Date and Place of Birth, Weights and Heights of Members of Athletic Teams.

To have any or all of the Directory Information withheld, the student must give written notice, in person or by certified mail, return receipt requested and addressed to the Registrar by the first day of each course or program, as the case may be, for which he/she is enrolled.

William Rainey Harper College has adopted policies and procedures implementing The Act, which are contained in the William Rainey Harper College Catalog and Student Handbook.

NEW students

You are a "New Student" if you have not previously been admitted to and have never been enrolled in credit courses at Harper College. You will need to complete an application for admission before you register. Applications are available online, in the Admissions Office, New Student Services and Art Center, C101, or by calling 847.925.6700.

STEP 1

Complete the application for admission, and submit it and a \$25 nonrefundable fee to the Harper College Admissions Office. Degree-seeking students are also required to submit an official high school transcript or GED results and official transcripts from each college attended. (Non-degree-seeking students are not required to provide transcripts.)

STEP 2

You are encouraged to attend a new student advising session. These small group sessions last about one and one-half hours and will give you information about Harper College programs, services, admission requirements and registration procedures. They also include an opportunity for each group member to speak with an advisor regarding course selection. Call 847.925.6208 to reserve a seat and/or to get more information. STEP 3

If you plan to enroll in your first college level English and/or math course, you must take computerized writing, reading and/or math assessment tests. Test results determine your placement in those courses and must be completed prior to registration. You may be eligible for a waiver of testing with appropriate ACT scores and/or college transcripts. STEP 4

If you apply to Harper for the summer session and plan to continue full time in the fall, please note that you will be invited to an orientation program which will include assessment testing, essential new student information, one-on-one counseling and registration.

Currently and previously enrolled credit students




