
Christmas Carroll

The Harper College Bookstore hosted a very timely event. On November 7, it was announced that author James Carroll was the recipient of the 1996 National Book Award for non-fiction. On November 20, Carroll was in the Bookstore signing copies of his award-winning book, An American Requiem: God, My Father, and the War That Came Between Us, for Terry Karow and other interested patrons. That evening Carroll gave a lecture in the Building J Theatre.

How did James Carroll happen to come to Harper? In the summer of 1995, **Greg Herriges**, an assistant professor of English at Harper, attended "Emerson College's *Plowshares* 6th Annual International Fiction Writing Seminar" in Holland. Carroll was Herriges' mentor for the intense two-week seminar, where they both wrote every day. In fact, Carroll was working on *God, My Father* at that time. Their friendship continued, and this summer Herriges suggested to Student Activities and the Cultural Arts Committee that they bring James Carroll to Harper.

Herriges reports, "James enjoyed his experience at Harper very much."















