Cardtopulmonary resusctation or CPR is external cardiac com－ prembons（supplying a heartbeat （breatheng for the vietum）．It ts an emergency firat ald procedur which may save the lufe of patient，fellow warker，friend or procedure；as simple as A．B．C Alrway－Breathing．Circulation．

Due to the generosity of the studect body, the Harper Health

## Board's political games obnoxious

Whayn tie last few months, the atmoaphere at Harper hes become increasingly tenve and the aptrit among faculy members has been quite low. The attempt by most Board of Truatee members to extricate Dr. Robert Labti, Pruldent of Harper College, from his 12 year pooition has added to the low morale of the coliege.

Lahu'e popularity began to decrease in April when Joan Klyesman, Jan Bone, and David Tomeneck Took there all backed by a union and very deffiltely not supporters of the preadene. Tomcheck ran a very strong porters of the preadient Tomebeck ran a very strong At the end of Sept
of the long antictpated Tadiock reard recelved ue resulty audit requeswd by Board members because of serious communication obstacles.

In short, the audif reported severe communicatipn problems, eapecialify with Board members and the faculty. It also showed a strong diasatiafaction with "the organisational cllmate and participative decislon-making."

Moat of the Board members decided rather than work at solving the problem it would be easier to get rid of it (Labd). Tomcheck fumped on the bandwagon by saylng "even If we keep the same cast of characters and change the masagement style, it won't be perceived that way and perception is critical if we wani our antempts to be suecesaful. The solution in obvious-go shopping.

As wae reported last week by Rena Wigh Coben of Paddock Publications, the Board is attempting to sever the 20 months let on Laht'e contract. The Board and Lahul's attorney are concluding talks in which they hope to attaln a compromise. According to Ms. Cohen's source, Lahit $b$ expected to be out in two months.

Due to The Harbtnger's collected information, we feel Laht will be removed much sooner. Withit
throe week Lahti'e ortice should become vacant it inevilable that the Board will have to shell out It is inevitable that the Board wim have to aheil out a somewhere in the neigigborhood of $\$ 100,000$.
"But Board members are williog to riak the financial hardehlp because of seemingty Irreconcilable differences with the college preaddent," reported Ms. Coben.

This willing pees to liquidate Lahd's contract by paying an enormous pum of money appeare to bea contradiction of the Board's current practices.

The Board has intensified the custom of reviewing Harper's expenditures every month. They examine the Hest of expenditures very closely and question any dia putyble expendthure.

In mid-July, Tomeheck diacovered an error in the al lotment of bonuses to Harper's 23 admingotrators. The Board approved $\$ 10,000$ for the bonuses. It was later learned that Lambti's offlice apent $\$ 14,000$; a diaclosur made by Tomcheck.

Chatrperson of the Board of Truatees, Ms. Shirley Munson, was contacted by The Harbinger and said "the practige occurred a number of years ago and it became an acespled practice. it was Just a mauter of the present

The Board exploren the colleges monthly expenditures and watches for careful spending. Each member is concerned that the budget remain balanced.
At the same time, most of the members are willing to subsidise approximately $\$ 100,000$ to relleve Dr. Labt of his poation. Thetr deatre for careful spending and thetr eagerness to diacharge Lahti appear to conflict with one another.
This is where the students and community enter the pleture. The burden of having to pay off Lahti's contract may place the Board in a finnnelal bind. It may be nee essary for them to turn to other sourves for help.
Last Spring, the Board djecussed the posslbuly of raising students tuilion. They decided, for the time being that they would not take that action.
Another avenue the Board could venture into is a ta referepdum. However, it would be diffeult to gain the of an increage in tares.

If the Board does find themselves in a financial bind hike in student's tultion may be the easiest way for the alke in student's tultion may be the easiest way for Un Board to remove the pressure off of their shoulders. indit states, "the College is reducing to general fund audir staies, alame annually and it's dependent on tis rapldly decreasing reserves. Yet it has no Interim or long range plan for dealing with the problem.
During the turmoil at Harper, many people fear that the students are being overlooked. Chalrperson Munson stated that the Board's only concern is for the students. "The Hoard to being very careful and making sure that a bad atmosphere ion't brought into the classroom.
Concerning meeting atudents' needs, the audit report atated that there was some "concern that the institutions primary locus is on management techniques rather than educational programs.
In addition, the enormous attention being granted to the removal of Lahti has put a clamp on the Board's ability to deal with important business. There have been projects which have been retarded because the Board has not given them reepectable attention. A comment made by a stall member in the audir was, As a resull of Board intruilon into mar don except stopped."
One of the major arens of Importance to the Board'e awalting business is the mapter plan. The plan outlines Harper's future goals and misation.
The master plan has not been renewed since $t$ was constructed 12 years ago.
The Board and staff are not sure of the College's position on certain topics, as indicated by the audit report, which is where the plan becomes important. This knowledge is cesential if the Board hopes to come to grips with probiems which will tace the college in the future.

The Board must deal soon with the decision on whether
second campus ts necessary and economically feasible.
At the moment, Harper does not have a Dean of Student Services. A decigion must be made as to whether the position is necessary. The audit report explains concerns about the position.
"Concerns have been raised about the level of effort required of the bead of student servlces. Questions have bpen raised about the deed for a dean to coordinate these services and report directly to the vice president We quetalled functional analyeis of this operation is in order before such a position is authorised."

The Board has a lot of serious business awaiting their careful atiention. If they continuc to delay these projects and concern themselves only with playing political games, not only will the institution suffer, but so will the students.

Attorncy General Wulliam J. Scott today flied an antitrust suit
in federal court in Spring fivid againal tive highway construction frme. Scots noled that this suil represents the elighth "highway
cane" flied uy his Antitruat Div) slon against sixty delendanst accused of rigging the wida on State of Mlinois highway construction projects. Scott believes that these
will ultimatidy result in the recovwill ultimately resulh in the recov-
ery of millione of dollars of damapes to the State

The suit allages that a group of highway contractors consplred to
rig bide on a contract Involving uridge
Scolt stated thal the damages to the State resulting from the
alleged antlirust violations have
not yet been determined but he anticipated that the recovery could be quite substantal. Scott noted that the antitrunt laws are an of fective deterrent to uusinessmen through priceflaing wee puse of the "Treble damage" provitions contained whitin the laws. These provilions allow the Stiste, or any

Student Trustee guidelines set up by III. legislature

The Mincils legislature passed House Bill 1628 in Seplember 1973, providing for non-voting atudent representation on all colleges and four-year Instifutions. The law, signed by Governor Walkes, beeame effective October 1, 1973. The community college section of the law sulpulates that each coliege's Board of Trustees the college under the jurxdiction of the Board. Through a eampus-wide relerendum held at Harper College shortly thereafter, the procedure for the selection of a student truttue was devermi ned. The student trustee is elected by popular vote of the student body. The Student Senate, as election commitre, is responalble for oversee ing all election procedures. in order to
qualify, a candidate (1) muat be a full-time student (nine or more credit hours furing bolh the Fall and Spring semesters), and (2) must reside within the Harper College District 512 . The term of office was revised by House Bill 679 which be came $\ln w$ on September 16, 1977. Theterme of offer for next year ooly wib begin on July 1,1978 and terminate on April 14, 1979. Thereafter, the student trustee will eerve one year terms beginning on April 15 and ending on the following April 14.

The ond of the Chicago Dally Newa is not only the death of a major invitution, but the death of a large part of Chicago and the suburbs.
B. The Dally News was atarted 102 years ago by Melville B. Stone, Nith $\$ 5,000$ invested in the company. At that time there was six dally newspapers to compete with. A yoar later he was planning to fold the paper, but Lawsoa bought the peper and put $\$ 6.000$ into the project. He stayod with the nowapaper for about 50 years.
During that cime the newspaper staffed such outstandIng writers as Cari Sandburg, Ben Hecht, Finley Peter Dumne, Bugene Fiold, and John Gunther. The Dally In the pass.
The newspaper ran Into trouble when It's circulation dropped from about 400,000 to 330,000 in three years. tinas losing approximately $\$ 11$ militon a year. it was flinally

As soon as newspapers like the Chlcago Tribune, Chicaso Sun-Times and the Dally Herald heard of the comins death of the Dally News, they began large adver. thaine campaigne. These campaigns dealt with everything from television and radio advertising to giving out Tree newspapers and reduced subscription ratea soon newspaper in an effort to capture some of the Dally News readors. is has been appearing on the Chtcago mewstands, whoreas before it was primarily svalluble only in the suburbs.

We should insiat that our communlibes bulld and operate "lotal recyciting" facilites, where the garbage companies would be forced to bring the garbage instead of dumping a. a would aukenadeoliy be separaied andsoid to the dilferent sluminum copper stel, paper. ploss, for meyeling and rese The remaining malierial could be procemed insofertllior. This could be handled on an area-wide baslo atmilar to mumicipal secaage dioposal syasems, which are tax supported. Ferhape thls type of lactliky coald become mell-supporting by the sale of material to induatry.
This approach is an exciting proapeet for the near future, and devervee our whol-heartod mpport and the backing of governnent so a significant facior in the iolving of a number of our modern ifie problems. This aystem would conserve limised natural unalighaly garbage mountains and dumps.
