

Since the campus was opened students have had to wait in Building A for the buses. During the coldest months it is simply an impossibility to wait for a bus outside. Once the bus arrived there would be a mad dash over (possibly) icy sidewalks.

Plans have been made for a shelter sometime dur-ing this semester. The Harbinger urges Harper Col-lege to press this issue so that we do not find ourselves in the middle of another winter without a shelter.

Vice President of Administrative Services Peter R. Bakas sent a letter to the RTA in the middle of last July inquiring about the status of the shelter and has yet to receive a reply from them.

The RTA maintains that it is the Village of Pal-atine's duty to install the shelter. Harper has been ready and willing to install the shelter for quite some

Now is the time for the administration of this school to secure a bus shelter with as little delay as possible. No one can argue that it is a real need given the campus's layout and the local winter weather.

Harper worked for passage of the Health Safety legislation recently, which enables the college to rate evenue for such needs. Prior to the passage of the legislation by the Illinois General Assembly, the College was forced to take money out of other funds, as there was often not money available for projects.

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Now that the college does have money on hand for projects in the areas of health or safety, we at the Harbinger feel a need to plead for this justified project.

An architect's dreams, a people's self-image, and a way of life were all saved by the government's historic preservation program.

Another important program is the Targeted Jobs Tax Credit Program. This program is scheduled to expire at the end of this year (baring a legislative renewal by Congress).

The program helps those hard to employ find jobs: the handicapped, supplemental security income recipients, welfare recipients, aid to families with dependant children recipients, aid to commically dis-advantaged youth who all are covered under the recomment. program

An employer who hires a person from one of these groups receives a tax credit equal to one half of the first 56,000 of the first years wages, and up to a quarter of first 56,000 of the second year.

By employing those that have a hard time finding a job the program has benefits that cannot be directly translated to monetary gains, but instead create a stronger society as a whole, where everyone has a chance to participate.

These are just a few government programs made ssible under the present flexible tax system.

A flat tax takes away much of the governments ability to belp make our society stronger. We as a nation have made some serious commit-ments around the world. We are kidding ourselves to believe that we can have low taxes with a complex society and international involvements.

With this in mind, we should look to how we can modify our present system, not replace it with an inflexible one that can not meet the needs of our complex societies.

AIDS is a disturbing specter shadowing America that demands immediate attention from the federal government. Only the government has the resources necessary to confront the massive educational and research projects that lie ahead of us.

The disease holds numerous explosive social implications that extend far beyond health concerns.

There are the troubling issues of privacy, confiden-tialality, and civil rights. Should health insurance be able to rewrite policies because of homosexuality?

The Army is aiready testing for AIDS in new recruits. With the AIDS hysteria in full swing (sup-posedly rational adults are still concerned about con-tracting the disease from door knobs) there is a very real concern in the homosexual community over job security.

These are just some of the more mundane, every-day effects of ther disease.

Contrary to some uninformed individuals there is not chance of getting the disease from drinking glasses. The virus dies very quickly outside the body. The only way in can be effectively transmitted is through blood and other body fluids.

What is needed is an elective educational program to make the public aware of the particulars of the problem is: lis degree of infectiousness, how to act responsibly to avoid contracting the disease.

With the more than 30,000 cases expected by the end of 1986 it seems obvious that we should make it our number one health priority.




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# Way to Go WHCM!!!

To quote National Education President Mary Hat-wood Putrell, "All is not well out there—despite the rosy picture the Administration attempts to paint of the nation's economic landscape."

Sent to Congress on Feb. 5, the Reagan Admin-istration's budget proposals for educational pro-grams revealed a 15% cut. Surchy this negates the "educational renaissance" the President boasted in his State of the Union Address!

One day after his speech to the nation. crafty Mr. Reagan wields the new budget to request a \$23 billion SS million pumping of military spending. Added to a \$678 million to be slashed on March 1 under the Gramm-Rudman law, these cuts hardly are repre-sentative of advantageous, calculated thinking on our leader's behalf.

The 1987 budget maintains rescissions which will appropriate \$1.4 billion less in college financial aid assistance, a fact which should prompt a serious con-cern from the current 5.7 million students receiving grants and/or loans.

Proposed cutbacks would threaten the fall of the entire Guaranteed Student Loan program, as well as force nearly one-third of the students enjoying Pell grants to lose their eligibility.

What do Reagan's cuts mean for Harper students? Increased difficulty in receiving aid here, and, for transfer students, more difficulty in making it to the college of their choice.

Why now, Mr. Reagan? And what next? Won't you stop grinning as you frantically push the buttons of your giant calculator? "Don't pay atten-tion to that man behind the curitain," just won't suf-fice anymore. Come out and SUPPORT us!!!

As college students, we frown upon that "man behind the curtain", responsible for creating unnec-essary hardships on our road to educational success.

# Wartime administrator Criticizes U.S. policies Dr. Daniel Ellsberg rips apart U.S. military involvements

Later. when Ellsberg went public with his knowledge of the deception, he was informed by Senator Morris that had he information, the approval of the Senate never would have come

come. Realizations like these may explain Ellsberg's tremendous drive and commitment to speak out on past and present foreign policies. A prime example of this commitment to speak out would have to be his involvement in the releas-ing of "The Pentagon Papers." However, a commitment to the spreading of public awareness was not always one of his goals.

With surprising candor, Ellsberg admitted that he witheld information on Viet-nam from the public on several occasions, because it never occured to him to reveal it.

According to Dr. Ellsberg. he survived attempts on his life and a lengthy court battle to secure the disclosure of "The Pentagon Papers." Despite the fact that it never occured to him to release cer-tain information. Ellsberg revealed that his reluctance may have cost an untold number of buman lives. These "Papers" traced our involvement in Vietnam, mak-ing public the often misguided policies and deception of the

According to Ellsberg, he failed to disclose the fact has a concerning the Tonkin Content of the senter of the sen

the situation in El Salvador. During a dinner conversa-tion, the seemingly low-key Ellaberg became animated vador was brought up. "If any country has a right to revolt, it's El Salvador." he remarked This definitely was a surprising statement, com-ing from a pacifist like himsel.

Ellaberg also addressed U.S. and Soviet relations. citing the failure of the Reagan Admin-stration to consult the Soviet's offer of a nuclear test ban. Ellaberg said the Soviet is have offered to end nuclear tests if the United States would agree to do the same.

He went on to say that "as an act of good faith" the U.S.S.R. has put an end to tests as of August. However. Reagan has rejected the Soviet's proposals much to Ellsberg's dismay. "Are the Soviet's sincere?"

Editor-in-Chief Sergeant James Galiardo of the Lovington. New Mexico Police Department. a former Harper Public Safety Officer, has been awarded the Silver Star for Bravery award from the American Police Hall of Fame.

Fame. This Hall of Fame, located in Sarasota County, Florida, is a national memorial to officers killed in the line of duty, houses a museum of police artifacts and serves as a crime preven-tion center.

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


